

2.2 million youth impacted by national ministry ST. PAUL, MN,

[Saint Paul, MN date] – Young people are leaving the Catholic Church at an alarming rate. In fact, 13 is the average age a young person walks away from the Church (Going, Going, Gone, St. Mary's Press, 2018). To re-engage these young people, NET Ministries, for the past 40 years, inspire over 2.2 million young people to love Christ and embrace the life of the Catholic Church through evangelization and discipleship. has trained over 3,000 young adults in how to proclaim the Gospel through retreat and discipleship ministry

One way NET carries out its mission is through training young adults in how to proclaim the Gospel through retreat and discipleship ministry. This year, 148 young adults coming from all across the United States, split into 14 teams, have answered the call to mission. While serving on a NET Team for nine months, missionaries, ages 18-28, lead transformative retreats and personal discipleship groups at various parishes and schools in over 110 dioceses.

With an invitation from each diocese's bishop, nine of the 14 teams lead retreats featuring small group discussions, large group presentations, prayer ministry, lively games, dynamic music, dramatic and funny skits, and inspiring talks to motivate the youth to be unafraid to accept God in their lives. Through this ministry, NET Retreat Teams have led over 35,000 retreats in parishes and schools all across the country.

One young person says of her experience on retreat, "I saw men and women around my age loving God, and it encouraged me to stay strong. What NET Ministries is doing is brilliant. They are encouraging, understanding, energetic, charismatic, and above all incorporate God into everything that they do."

Along with retreat ministry, the other five teams focus on discipleship, serving a church or school for nine months, in order to enrich Catholic culture and build a community of disciples that have a lasting relationship with Christ. The teams work alongside the parish or school staff to help expand the current ministry program and ultimately form those in the parish or school to be disciples in their own community.

Through peer-to-peer ministry, NET missionaries are able to be a witness to young people on a personal level and give them an example of how to live out their faith amidst the pressures of the culture today. By giving them an example, young people have been drawn back to the Church and see the beauty in the communities around them.

Along with missionary teams, NET re-engages young people through YDisciple, a toolbox of training resources for adults and teaching resources for teens specifically designed with small groups in mind. These resources include the highest caliber videos for young people, leader guides to help adults facilitate meaningful discussion, participant guides, and parent resources.

When using YDisciple, one youth minister says, "YDisciple's resources truly meet every teen where they are at in the journey, proclaim the Gospel and lead to enthused conversations."
